

FOCINVEZ[™] is a prescription medicine used in patients 6 months of age and older to prevent nausea and vomiting caused by certain anti-cancer medicines (chemotherapy). When used for this purpose, FOCINVEZ[™] is always used with other medicines that treat nausea and vomiting.

FOCINVEZ[™] is not used to treat nausea and vomiting that you already have. It is not known if FOCINVEZ[™] is safe and effective in children less than 6 months of age.

What is FOCINVEZ[™]?

How is FOCINVEZ[™] given?

FOCINVEZ[™] is a prescription medicine that helps to prevent nausea and vomiting caused by some types of chemotherapy



FOCINVEZ[™] doesn't treat cancer, but it is a part of some cancer treatment plans. Some kinds of chemotherapy that treat cancer are more likely to cause side effects of nausea and vomiting. FOCINVEZ[™] is given before these kinds of chemotherapy to help prevent nausea or vomiting. When used for this purpose, FOCINVEZ[™] is always used with other medicines that treat nausea and vomiting. FOCINVEZ[™] is not used to treat nausea and vomiting that you already have.

For adults 18 years of age and older, FOCINVEZ™ is given by intravenous (IV) infusion in the patient's vein

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FOCINVEZ[™] is approved for use in patients 6 months of age and older. It is not known whether FOCINVEZ[™] is safe and effective in children less than 6 months of age. For children 6 months to 17 years of age, FOCINVEZ™ is given through a type of IV called a central line

If you have any questions about FOCINVEZ[™], ask your healthcare provider.

Before you take or receive FOCINVEZ[™], tell your doctor about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- Have liver problems
- Are pregnant or plan to become pregnant
- Are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed

If you take the blood thinner warfarin (also known as Coumadin® or Jantoven®), your healthcare provider may do blood tests to check your blood clotting after you receive FOCINVEZ™.

*Depending on your child's chemotherapy treatment plan, they may also take aprepitant by mouth in a tablet or liquid form on Days 2 and 3. If your child will receive oral aprepitant, see the Patient Information for those products for further information.

[†]The duration of infusion for FOCINVEZ[™] is 30 minutes for patients 12 years to 17 years of age and 60 minutes for patients 6 months to less than 12 years of age.





What are the possible side effects of FOCINVEZ[™]?

Side effects can occur during treatment with FOCINVEZ[™]. It is important to stay in close communication with your or your child's healthcare provider throughout your treatment.

Serious side effects can occur with FOCINVEZ[™]. Contact your healthcare provider right away if you experience any of the following:

- Signs of a serious allergic reaction, such as:
 - Hives, rash, itching, flushing or redness of your face or skin
 - Trouble breathing or swallowing
 - Dizziness
 - A rapid or weak heartbeat
 - Feeling faint during or soon after you receive FOCINVEZ™
- Signs of severe skin reactions, such as rash, skin peeling, or sores
- Signs of an infusion site reaction, such as pain, swelling, and redness where the IV was placed in your or your child's body

In adults, the most common side effects of FOCINVEZ[™] include:

- Tiredness
- Diarrhea
- Low white blood cell and red blood cell counts
- Weakness

- Feeling weak or numb in your arms and legs
- Painful or difficult digestion, or changes in digestion (dyspepsia)
- Urinary tract infection
- Pain in your arms and legs

In children 6 months to 17 years of age, the most common side effects of FOCINVEZ[™] include:

- Low red blood cell count
- Low white blood cell count
- Low blood platelet count
- Low white blood cell count with a fever



FOCINVEZ[™] may cause serious side effects, including:

In adults, the most common side effects of FOCINVEZ[™] include tiredness; diarrhea; low white blood cell and red blood cell counts; weakness; feeling weak or numb in your arms and legs; painful, difficult, or changes in your digestion (dyspepsia); urinary tract infection; and pain in your arms and legs.

In children 6 months to 17 years of age, the most common side effects of FOCINVEZ™ include low red blood cell count, low white blood cell count, low blood platelet count, and low white blood cell count with a fever.

Tell your healthcare provider if you have any side effect that bothers you or that does not go away.

These are not all the possible side effects of FOCINVEZ[™]. For more information, ask your healthcare provider or pharmacist. Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects.

Do not take FOCINVEZ[™] if you are allergic to fosaprepitant, aprepitant, or any of the ingredients in FOCINVEZ[™].

Serious allergic reactions, such as anaphylaxis. Get emergency medical help right away if you get any

of the following symptoms of a serious allergic reaction: hives, rash, itching, flushing or redness of your face or skin, trouble breathing or swallowing, dizziness, a rapid or weak heartbeat, or if you feel faint during or soon after you receive FOCINVEZ[™]. Severe skin reactions, which may include rash, skin peeling, or sores, may occur.

• Infusion site reactions (ISRs) at or near the infusion site have happened with FOCINVEZ[™]. Most severe ISRs have happened with a certain type of chemotherapy medicine that can burn or blister your skin (vesicant) with side effects, including pain, swelling, and redness. Death of skin tissue (necrosis) has happened in some people getting this type of chemotherapy medicine. Most ISRs can happen with the first, second, or third dose and some can last up to 2 weeks or longer. Tell your healthcare provider right away if you get any infusion site reactions.

• Are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if FOCINVEZ[™] can harm your unborn baby. Women who use birth control medicines containing hormones to prevent pregnancy (birth control pills, skin patches, implants, and certain IUDs) should also use a backup method of birth control that does not contain hormones, such as condoms and spermicides, during treatment with FOCINVEZ[™] and for 1 month after receiving the last dose

• Are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if FOCINVEZ[™] passes into your breast milk. Talk to your
